
From Fr Ben

Ki te hunga e arohaina ana e Te Karaiti ki Kemureti, kia tau te aroha noa me te rangimārie ki a koutou.

To the beloved in Christ throughout Cambridge (which is everyone!), grace and peace.

Over the past two weeks I have been reflecting on the beginnings of a exhortation which I have been reading. This exhortation has been challenging to read as I, and we, are reminded of the great responsibility to which we have been entrusted. In our faith, we believe that,

God has acted in Jesus to bring us back to a loving and forgiven relationship. In that action all humanity is offered re-creation and wholeness. (ANZPB, 926)



In the faith and knowledge of receiving that very love, we are obligated to reciprocate that same love both to God and to one another. It is the reciprocation of that love which is the fruit and the ongoing evidence of our baptism and salvation in Christ. The essence of the love of God is that it is to be shared; its existence is seen in its sharing.

And, this is the rhythm of our community worship together. We have an ebb and flow of being called to receive anew the love of God in the forgiveness, in the body and blood of Christ at the eucharist and then we are sent out by God through the words of the liturgist and our affirmation, "Go now to love and serve the Lord. Go in peace. Amen. We go in the name of Christ." This is some of the rhythm and cycle that we are called into by our God: to receive the love and sustenance we need in the sacrament and to take that same love and be sent to share it in the world. The sacrament is most fully revealed to us not only in receiving the body and blood of Christ but in allowing God's love to permeate every part, every interaction, every action of our lives. In this, we see the sacrament fully, in this we see the holistic nature of the sacrament and our life in God as a community.

The challenging exhortation that I mentioned at the beginning of my whakaaro (*thoughts*) is the Apostolic Exhortation *Dilexi Te* of Pope Leo XIV to all Christians on Love for the Poor. What is so challenging about this exhortation is the way that our mission, duty, responsibility, or obligation even, to love the poor is so intricately intertwined with our salvation. That Jesus calls for all Christians to love and serve the poor. We see this time and time again in his ministry, the way in which Jesus is defined by his compassion for the poor, the way in which Jesus is constantly moved to compassion for the poor, and the way in which Jesus encourages and empowers us to have compassion for those that are poor. Jesus, who is fully God and fully human, reveals the character and nature of God to us. Therefore, we ought to follow him and do the same. To allow ourselves to be defined by our compassion for the poor, those poor of heart, poor of sustenance, poor of spirit, poor of relationships, poor of clothing, poor of love. It is in each of these that Jesus waits for us all to discover his presence (Matthew 25:34-45). It is in each that a new relationship, new journey, new blessings are waiting to be revealed to us all.

Generous and compassionate God, empower us by your Holy Spirit to overcome our desire to keep your love for ourselves, help our hearts to be moved to compassion by that which stirs your heart, strengthen us to enter the possibilities that love offers to all, especially the poor; through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

And helped the clergy get along!


*You are our sunshine, go with our blessing,

OBITUARY - Wayne Koskela: faithful bell-ringer at St Andrew's Church for over two decades.

On Tuesday, 11 November 2025, in the Care Unit of Metlifecare St Andrews, Wayne Koskela died at the age of 82. He never expected to reach the age of 80, saying the men in his family didn't do that. But there's always an exception to every rule and Wayne was certainly an exceptional man. A real gentleman with a strong community spirit as demonstrated by his commitment as a St John's volunteer and to the team of ringers here in St Andrew's belfry for as long as he was able.

There is no exact record of when he first arrived in the belfry but there are photos of him from the 2000/2001 New Year's ring and he is listed as a ringer in December 2001. Also he is recorded as having joined the ring for the service held in memory of the Queen Mother, 7 April, 2002, No.6 bell being rung once for each year of her life, a total of 101 times.

From then on Wayne made his place in our ranks as a man with a quick mind, wonderful sense of humour and ability to play with words, lover of music and a true gentleman, as well as mastering No.6 – the heavy anchor bell – which he made his own. He was there when our numbers were so low we entered for a Waipa Heritage Traditional Skills and Knowledge Award as an incentive for the new ringers to work towards. There is no doubt that a good solid ringer on No.6 is invaluable for setting timing! He was there when the ringers held an A'pealathon to raise money for Christchurch after the earthquake, making sure there was always at least one ringer there to cover when anyone came to try the bells during the 12 hour period of the event.

Always there for Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve rings and if, as a volunteer, he was rostered for duty with St John's on any bell ringing occasion, he would be in the belfry in uniform, ready to go but not ready to miss the bells if not required by anybody else. Sunday service, weddings, funerals, Christmas or New Years Eve – if the bells were called for, Wayne would be there to ring.




