Christmas at St Andrew's Church

December was a busy month in the Church and Parish Centre with various services and events, including the annual Nine Lessons & Carols, Christmas Eve Carols & Midnight Mass, and Christmas Day services. We enjoyed welcoming visitors, both locals and tourists, during this special season in the Christian calendar.

Advent Garden 2025

The four week long season of Advent is a time dedicated to the reflective preparation for the arrival, "advent", of Christ's nativity at Christmas time and also Christ's expected return in the second coming.

To remind us of the Christmas story, a group of parishioners created an Advent Garden, a visual display at the back of the church. The display changed each week, telling the story leading to Jesus' birth and remained in place until the Epiphany, finishing with the arrival of the Magi. Whilst it did not follow the themes for the four weeks of Advent directly, each week reminded us of the events surrounding Jesus' birth. The themes for the display were 1: The Birth of Jesus Foretold, 2: Mary and Joseph Travel to Bethlehem, 3: There was no Room at the Inn, 4: Mary and Joseph Wait, 5: Jesus is Born, 6: The Magi Bring Gifts.

Such displays are common place through Europe at this time of year, many are very large and a number change daily, following the Lectionary. It was hoped that the offering at St Andrew's was another way of helping us reflect on the events leading up to Christmas.



During this period, the Church was open from 10 am until 1 pm during each weekday and it was pleasing to see the number of people who came into the church to take advantage of the doors being open. Alongside many Christmas displays around town, St Andrew's was able to provide a Christian perspective to the anticipation of Christmas. Many thanks to all those who gave of their time to sit in the church during the opening times to be available to answer questions for the members of the public who visited.



Afternoon Christmas Eve Service – for the Young, Families and those Young at Heart

Those of you who watched the unfolding story told by the Advent Garden may have noticed an owl perched on top of the stable. This gave the clue to the Christmas Eve service where the young people presented *The Grumpy Owl and the Joy of Christmas*. This story was a resource promoted by the Church of England for churches in planning for Advent.

The story of the nativity was acted out by the children of the parish, aided by narrators Merv Hunt and Liz Lightfoot. The leading role of the Owl was taken by Elliot Kirkby-McLeod. The story was told by the animals, with the Owl interacting with donkey, the sheep, camel and lastly a fox!

The Owl was a grumpy owl who liked peace and quiet. If she was annoyed or disturbed she became extremely grumpy. Firstly, her peace was broken by the donkey accompanied by Mary and Joseph coming into her barn. She decided to leave and flew off to some empty fields to find peace and quiet. After a short time, over the hill came some sheep and shepherds. The Owl didn't like that intrusion so she flew off again. The next empty space she found was a desert. That was fine until camels and wise men appeared. That was again too much for the Owl so she flew off, landing this time in a snow covered landscape where the only noise was the wind. This was perfect! A fox turned up and invited the Owl to shelter in his burrow which the Owl thought was fine until she realized the fox had other ideas! At that stage the Owl decided the barn wasn't so bad after all.

Arriving back at the barn, there were so many people and animals around Mary, Joseph and their baby and the Owl settled on the roof to watch proceedings, still feeling very grumpy. Until she looked down at baby Jesus and looked into his eyes. The Owl's heart melted and a warm feeling came over her – **Joy**. She flew off around the village to invite all the animals to "come and see" the wonderful thing that had happened.


